Sweetmeats (1907)

- Here is a good example of syncopation; a very simple arrangement of Sweetmeats, written by Percy Wenrich in 1907 (aged 27)
- His first ragtime piece was written at age 17.
 It was called L'Inconnu, which means unknown, unfamiliar or strange an appropriate description of ragtime. Percy described it as "a two-step with a fancy title." The two-step was a dance. And people danced to ragtime.
- Sweetmeats is not slang for anything. It means candied fruit, such as sugar plums or candied orange peels



Percy Wenrich (1880-1952)

- born in Joplin, Missouri, studied music in Chicago
- moved to New York City around 1907 to work as a Tin Pan Alley composer
- married a vaudeville performer and they toured together for many years
- composed at least 18 rags
- best known for his popular music and worked with a number of talented lyricists
- Sweetmeats (1907) Crab Apples (1908)
